GOERING CHEATS GALLOWS

Nuernberg, Germany-(CP)- Herman Goering, flamboyant to the end, cheated the hangman with a capsule of cyanide last night, but ten other ringleaders of punctured Nazi Reich died at the end of a rope in the dark hours before dawn today, in payment for crimes against the world.

Goering twitched out his life in his isolated prison cell only a few hours before his condemned henchmen plunged through hanging traps of two gallows in a grimy building 35 yards away.

Intelligence officers are mystified as to how Goering obtained the poison. Ten of the men who died on the gallows went to their deaths without collapsing, making "God save Germany" their final declarations.

Those who died on the gallows, in order of hanging were Joachim Von Ribbentrop; Field Marshal Wilhelm Keitel; Ernst Kaltenbrunner, Head of Nazi Security Police; Alfred Rosenberg, Nazi Party Philosopher; Hans Frank, Governor-General of Poland; Wilhelm Frick, "Protector" Bohemia Moravia; Saulius Streicher, Jew Baiter; Fritz Saed, Slave Labor boss; Col. Gen. Alfred Jodl; Arthur Seyss-Inquart.

No arrests have been made yet in connection with Goering's suicide. An official said none are contemplated presently.

Streicher was the only one to create a scene at the scaffold, defiantly shouting "Heil Hitler."

Where bodies of executed Germans were taken, will remain secret, security Police Officials declared emphatically.

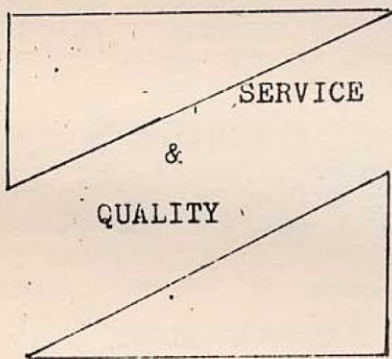

HIGHWAY TO FLIN FLON WITHIN THREE YEARS

At a C.C.F. rally held in the Community
hall on Thursday Oct 10th the Hon. J. T.
Douglas, minister for highways and public
works in the Saskatchewan Legislature
told an interested audience that it was
the intention of his Government to com-
plete the highway from Nipawan to Flin
Flon within the three years originally
allotted for this project and that after
flying over the area he was satisfied
this would be accomplished. Mr. Douglas
also praised the potential possibilities
of the tourist attractions around Beaver
Lake and said he intends to go back to
Regina and boost this area to the utmost.

Mr. Berry Richards, our representative
to the Manitoba Legislature and Mr.
Ronald Moore, the Federal member for this
area, also gave short addresses at this
meeting. Mr. Richards hopes to return
to Flin Flon after the next session of
the Manitoba Government to be held in
February, and Mr. Moore reminded us that
as soon as the shortage of material was
corrected we are in line for a federal
building, and he also requested veterans
to bring their problems to his attention
and he would do his best to reach a set-
tlement for them.
